Recommendations

- Ensure effective establishments of Anti Harassment Cells (AHC) in institutional and RMG factories to prevent violence against women.
- Functionalizing day care centers in factories to ensure women's effective participation.
- Initiate consistant dialogue meetings both at national & international levels to advocate women's rights.
- Inclusion of 6 months Maternity Leave in Bangladesh Labor Law.
- Ensure women & girls safety in just transition and climate adaptation process.
- Strengthen proper implementation of laws and policies to protect women & girls safety.
